Medical Terminology: A Programmed Approach is the ideal resource for instructors and students wanting a concise and systematic approach to learning the language of health care. Recognizing that students learn medical terminology by constructing and deconstructing words into their parts, the authors have built this process into the text and the numerous exercises. The approach builds and constantly reinforces skills needed to deal with increasingly complicated terms. A body systems organization is used, providing a clear content framework for the text. Each body system chapter separates words into easily learnable groups: major parts of each system; word parts related to each system; and diagnostic, pathological, surgical and pharmacological terms. Carefully chosen chapter features help bring the subject to life, and add an on-the-job perspective. Case-study information is built into examples, and real medical documents are used whenever appropriate. Internet references are included throughout to emphasize the importance of online resources and tools. While most activities are straight-forward practice exercises, word-building and critical thinking skills are also built in. Wherever possible, material on Complementary and Alternative Medicine ("CAM") is included to highlight this growing area of medicine. In addition to the text, students can access a wealth of electronic resources to aid their studies: The Student CD-ROM includes a suite of activity-based learning tools: crossword puzzles, "Hangman" game, "Concentration", term to definition matching, audio feedback, and "That's Epidemic", an activity focusing on pathology terms. Exercises are gradable online, or can be used for self-paced review. The Online Learning Center website ("OLC") provides a set of additional self-test questions; chapter study outlines; web links of interest; and additional word-building activities. An optional Spanish/English audio CD ROM is available, which includes pronunciations of key medical terms in both languages. English-language audio CD ROMs (2) are also available as an optional package item; these include pronunciation of all terms included in the text. The related terms listings in the body systems chapters include anatomic terms, pathologic conditions, surgical procedures, and laboratory tests with pronunciations and definitions. Terms are grouped by body system with a focus on anatomy. Each chapter contains a variety of exercises to encourage reinforcement of terms: anatomy identification, fill-in the blank, matching, defining word parts. Answers to exercises grouped at the end of the book prevent students from being distracted by answers on facing page as s/he completes exercises. Related terms lists (with definitions) are not separated from chapter material by exercises, easing reinforcement from definitions. Focused reviews of a section appear immediately following the materials presentation. The reproductive and urinary systems now each have a separate chapter, dividing up the information to be learned into more manageable segments. Improved layout and integration of related terms lists into chapters enhances the usefulness of these sections. New content on oncology has been added in Chapter 5 Understanding the Body and Its Structure. All answers to exercises have been moved to the back of the book. In the eighth edition, the answers appeared right after the exercises in each chapter. Moving them to the back improves the flow of the text itself. The new edition has a layflat binding to making filling in the exercises easier.

The text teaches students **APPLIED** terminology, demonstrating exactly how medical terminology is used in the clinical practice setting. **Willis' Medical Terminology** features **COMPLETE** records with patient history included.
