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Constructivist Teaching Strategies discusses the practice of constructivism in the classroom. Both types of constructivism focus on individuals ' thinking rather than their behavior, but they have distinctly different implications for teaching related to three ideas in particular: the relationship of learning and long-term development, the role or meaning of generalizations and abstractions during development, and the mechanism by which development occurs.
